Teamwork From A Higher Consciousness: The Mystery, The Magic, The Miracle

As I write this message to you, I am still basking in the energy of the co-ed retreat which was held at the Menucha Retreat Center overlooking the Columbia River. Diana Moskal and I have been facilitating retreats for Unity of Salem since 1994, and each one seems to evolve into a powerful experience for all participants.

This year our theme was “Planting a Seed of Well-Being for the World.” We had designed the retreat so that our nineteen participants would be working in teams. There was a Choir Team, a Visioning Team, a Banner Team and a “To Do” Team. We spent all day on

Saturday busy in our groups, allowing Spirit to move and direct us, and then brought all of our efforts together on Sunday morning in a Worship Service.

This message, however, focuses on the Choir Team as being the most exemplary example of the Mystery, Magic and Miracle of Teamwork from a higher consciousness. When we allow room for God to move in our lives it is incredible what can occur. I had invited our Music Director, Rebecca, to write a theme song for the retreat some months ago. Nothing was forthcoming for her, and so our thought was to go to “Plan B”. What happened helped all of us to learn that

God doesn't need a Plan B. God works just fine with Plan A, if we get out of the way.

When we arrived at the Retreat Center on Friday afternoon, the melody for the song came through Rebecca – but only the melody. She tried to push out the words, but nothing happened. On Saturday morning, when I asked who would like to be on the Choir Team, seven people raised their hands. The remainder of the Teams formed and then we all left to do our specific tasks.

Rebecca explained to the choir that she had this melody, but nothing else. She gave the team some options, one of which was to help her put words to the melody and after a very short discussion, the Choir Team made the decision to write a song to go with the melody.

A Message From The Board President

Dr. Bonnie Jean Young:

The Board of Trustees has been busy this past month supporting the activities of the Planning Committee for the First Annual Interfaith Festival, held September 20, 2008 at Unity of Salem.

First Annual Interfaith Festival: An all day work party was held on September 13th with food provided for the volunteers. The grounds were cleaned, and new bark dust was applied on the flower beds and parking strips. The new Labyrinth was finished south of the site for the new Sanctuary. The new Gazebo was adorned with gray slate flooring and grass was mowed short to make room for all the booths. A program of music and speakers involving many faiths was presented from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Approximately 400+ attendees found their way to our sacred nine acres on the hill. Some of those folks have since appeared at our Sunday service and have found a new spiritual home. We were amazed to see our program listed on the front page of the Statesman Journal newspaper on the day of the Festival thanks to Hank Ahrend, the religious editor. Congratulations are due to everyone who helped. At the following Sunday Service the Festival committee was honored and a group of four who diligently worked on the grounds, the Labyrinth, and the Gazebo for an extraordinary number of hours was also given certificates of appreciation.

CORE Team Sets New Priorities: The CORE Team reported to the Board that they have expanded their mission to take in the list of projects generated by the Energizing Nine Acres Team. They have reprioritized the list for completion:

Thriving in Unity Program Update:

The Board of Trustees signed on to participate in the **Thriving in Unity Program** with the Association of Unity Churches. We currently have been approved for Level 2 and have agreed to meet all 12 benchmarks by April 30, 2009. We are in good company, 169 Unity groups have made the same commitment. The Association has hired a Director of Leadership Development and she is working with a committee to set the criteria for selecting a few spiritual communities to work within Level 3. The criteria will be available by the end of December. We have indicated our intent to apply for this three year commitment as a Pilot Program. If selected, we would receive about \$40,000 worth of training and assistance. To show our commitment, Rev. Georgie Richardson has sent our first full tithes to the Association in a letter to James Trapp, CEO of the Association. Rev. Georgie Richardson and the Board

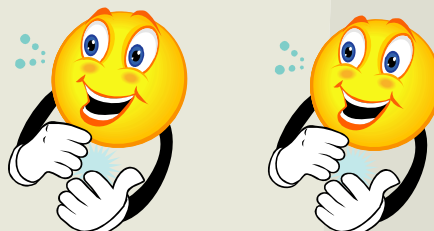

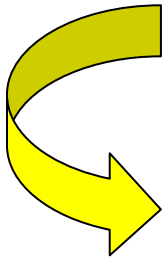
it wasn't a popular thing to do and for all the time energy and resources that each of you gave so freely.

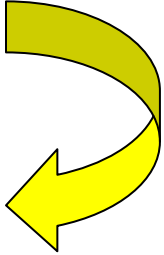

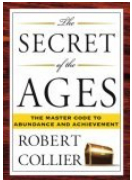
The Living Legacy Committee wishes to express their thanks to all those who have been interviewed and those yet to be interviewed. What an exciting way, to recognize and empower people and build community!

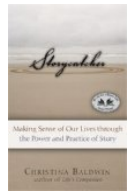
